



# Interim mid-year Household Estimates for England for 2001

The 2001 mid-year household estimates for England as a whole and by local authorities are given below. Mid-year household estimates for 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999 and 2000 are also provided.

## Key points

The key points are:

- The number of households in England in mid 2001 is estimated to be 20.715 million. This estimate is derived from the Office for National Statistics mid-year population estimates that are based on the 2001 Census. The estimates are interim subject to adjustment following further population information becoming available from the 2001 Census.
- The 2001 mid-year household estimates are mostly lower than the equivalent estimates for 2000. This is because the series from 1996 to 2000 is also subject to adjustment when revisions to the underlying population figures (taking account of the 2001 Census) are published by the Office for National Statistics in 2003.

## Estimates of numbers of households in 2001

The number of households in England in mid 2001 is estimated to be 20.715 million. This estimate is derived from the Office for National Statistics mid-year population estimates that are based on the 2001 Census. The estimates are interim and subject to adjustment following further population information becoming available from the 2001 Census during 2003.

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## Trends in household growth

The 2001 mid-year household estimates are mostly lower than the equivalent estimates for 2000. This is because the series from 1996 to 2000 is also subject to adjustment when revisions to the underlying population figures (taking account of the 2001 Census) are published by the Office for National Statistics in 2003.

The 1996-based household projections gave a projected increase in the number of households in England from 1996 to 2021 of 19 per cent. See Projections of Households in England to 2021, 1999, DTLR.

Household projections are based on past trends in household formation and population movements. Mid-year household estimates can be used to track estimated outturns for households based on more up to date evidence of the population by age and gender. Thus mid-year household estimates give some evidence of whether projected household numbers are becoming a reality.

## Regional comparisons

Table 1 gives the mid-year household estimates for the Government Office Regions from 1996 to 2001. The percentage increases 1996 to 2000 are the current best estimate of growth but subject to revision following further information from the 2001 Census.

The percentage increase in the number of households from 1996 to 2000 varies from 1.4 per cent in the North East to 6.1 per cent in London. This pattern of variation is similar to that given by the 1996-based household projections. The 2001 mid-year estimates are lower than the projected figures for all regions.

Household projections at county level and below are regarded as less robust than those at regional and national level. Similarly mid-year estimates at sub regional level are less robust than those at regional and national level. Therefore some care needs to be taken in interpreting these figures year on year. However it is still clear that, as with the mid-year population estimates on which these mid-year household estimates are based, there are considerable variations within regions as well as between regions.

## Methodology

Mid-year household estimates are produced annually as a complement to periodic household projections. The mid-year 2001 household estimates have been produced using the 1996-based household projection and estimation model and the 2001 mid-year population estimates from the Office for National Statistics that were published on 10 October. However, household formation rates are not updated every year and the mid-year household estimates assume that household formation rates continue as projected. Information from the 2001 Census is needed to update household formation rates. This information should be available in 2003. The 2001 mid-year household estimates should therefore be regarded as interim.

Although household formation rates tend to be stable over time, in London much of the population increase over and above that projected in the 1996-based population projections is attributed to net inward migration into the country. Without additional information it not possible to establish whether the household formation rates of these migrants is similar to the current trend in London. In these circumstances

the mid-year estimate for London is the best available but should be viewed with some caution.

Table 2 gives the mid-year estimates in the form of the current local authority organisation. In addition estimates are given for the counties as they existed prior to local government re-organisation in 1996. These include the former metropolitan counties and other counties that were completely abolished such as Cleveland, now covered by the unitary authorities of Hartlepool, Middlesbrough, Redcar and Cleveland and Stockton-on-Tees. Also it includes counties whose administrative areas were changed, such as the former county of Shropshire, whose area covered the present Shropshire County and the unitary authority of Telford and Wrekin. Figures quoted in the text above are those for the current administrative boundaries.
